The form, subtly shaped person in a 'C' and 'C' design, bears a dual meaning.

It embodies the initials of Dr. Christine Clark, co-founder of Kalandra Education, and the values of Care & Compassion upon which this award is founded.

Carved from the sacred Andesite stone of Taranaki Maunga, each piece resonates with the natural beauty and strength of this storied land.

It has been blessed by a Kaumatua from Te Kotahitanga o Te Atiawa, acknowledging the profound respect and care we extend to their Taonga when in our hands.

Its elegant teardrop form symbolises the deep emotions of those who grieve, and the blessed stone represents the shared lifeblood of humanity.

Mounted on a base of recycled wood, gifted years ago by a respected Kaumatua in the funeral industry, this handcrafted base fulfils his wish to see it used for something truly special - a fitting tribute to his legacy and a testament to his contribution.

In every detail, this piece is a symbol of reverence, a reminder of the compassion and respect we uphold for those in our care.
